KEYNOTE ADDRESS

Teaching in the Digital Age

Dr. Pixy Ferris, William Paterson University

Students in the 21st century -- the first generation to grow up in the digital age -- have unique learning needs. As educators we face the quandary of teaching these students in ways that promote effective learning without abdicating our role as experts. Directing the learning experiences of our students becomes a challenge to which it is essential we respond appropriately and effectively. In her presentation Dr. Ferris will identify Millennials' learning styles and discuss ways in which we can work with their learning needs. Together, participants will explore some ways to engage today's students in higher order learning, facilitate the exercise of critical thinking skills, and ensure students' mastery of conceptual, analytical, and theoretical knowledge without accommodating less productive traits such as the need for instant gratification and shallow thinking.
